The committee was established after the tragic events on the September 11th attacks, via Security Council resolution 1373 in 2001. It consists of all 15 members of the Security Council and primarily functions to monitor the execution of UN resolutions on counter-terrorism. The Counter-Terrorism Committee is supported by a secondary body called the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED), which aids in CTC's policy decisions by providing expert assistance to Member States. responsible for combating and preventing terrorism worldwide, and it does so through country visits and monitoring of global developments in terrorism.

This year, we will be focusing on two very important topics. The first topic is **the terrorist exploitation of children.** Many terrorist organizations around the world force children into inadequate roles such as fighters, suicide bombers, and various other equally violent roles. Terrorists continue to employ traditional methods of recruiting children (such as kidnapping, human trafficking, and coercion) but now combine them with new and adaptive strategies to also recruit children online. This allows terrorist organizations to reach an even wider pool of victims, making their methodology even more effective.

The second topic is **countering terror threats against vulnerable targets.** Terrorists often choose vulnerable or "soft targets" to execute their attacks, through which they achieve a greater amount of damage and death. It is imperative to search for solutions that will put an end to these horrendous attacks.
